

RESOURCE: INCLUDING INTERSEX

Developed, written, and informed by intersex professionals and intersex lived experience, this resource has been an ongoing passion project between Sexual Health and Family Planning ACT (SHFPACT) and A Gender Agenda (AGA) since 2018, bringing an often silent voice to the forefront.

Including Intersex is a unique resource for all educators wanting to provide an inclusive and equitable schooling experience to all students. This resource highlights the key issues and barriers facing intersex students in Australia and equips the reader with the tangible actions and resources to begin addressing these.

After identifying that information about the school experiences of intersex people was extremely sparse SHFPACT and AGA drew on their expertise to shape something specifically focussed on schooling. Including Intersex combines multidisciplinary knowledge and lived experience into this easy-to-use resource for all educators and school staff.

It is estimated that intersex people account for up to 1.7% of the global population. Across all school levels and systems, this equates to around 1300 to 1400 intersex students in the ACT school system at any given point in time (roughly 1 student in every 2-3 classrooms). This statistic means that educators have almost certainly encountered intersex students in their school communities, whether they were aware of it or not. It is important for school staff to be aware and inclusive of such diversity, especially given they have ethical and legal obligations to promote positive learning environments and model prosocial values that reflect and respect diversity in our community.

Including Intersex was developed and reviewed by intersex peer workers, and is a collaboration of two ACT community health organisations: A Gender Agenda (AGA) and Sexual Health and Family Planning ACT (SHFPACT).

WHAT HAPPENED IN 2021

3 FEBRUARY: WRITING THEMSELVES IN 4 NATIONAL LAUNCH

The Australian Research Centre in Sex, Health and Society (ARCSHS) at La Trobe University, with Rainbow Health Victoria and Rainbow Network held an online launch of the national Writing Themselves in 4 report.
