REACHING OUT : YWCA : 28 APRIL

SAIS met with the team at YWCA to discuss supporting LGBTIQA+ students on the Southside of the ACT, and to discuss the range of projects and programs each organisation is currently working on.

We also ran YWCA through some of the SAIS services and materials, extending our connections through the Healthy School's Network ACT.

BESPOKE SCHOOL-BASED PL : 9 MAY

We had the great pleasure of delivering a small bespoke training Professional Learning session for a Canberra primary school this term that presented a nice opportunity to deep dive into supporting student leadership initiatives and whole-of school inclusion.



BWF INCLUSIVE BADMINTON PROJECT : 15 MAY (ONGOING)

SAIS has had the privilege of joining an advisory group for a pilot project to look at inclusive practice in school badminton. This pilot program is taught over one school term, facilitated by Australian Capital Territory Badminton Association (ACTBA) coaches and Physical Education (PE) teachers.

The program features weekly social badminton sessions, complemented by an Australian Curriculum aligned PE Badminton unit of work of 9 lessons. We are incredibly proud to support this work.

EXPANDING KNOWLEDGE WITH SAIS TRAINING

UNIVERSITY OF CANBERRA GUEST LECTURE 6 JUNE

SAIS returned to UC for the third year, delivering a guest lecture for a unit in the Bachelor of Education degree focussed on challenges in educational environments. This lecture runs separately to our workshop on inclusive sports for pre-service teachers, and instead focusses on supporting same-sex attracted, intersex, transgender and gender diverse students at school.

For the first time we presented a face-to-face lecture, featuring updated content from the virtual presentation delivered in previous years. The lecture was received well and we received great feedback and comments from students. We were pleased to be able to join the post-lecture workshop activities and discussion.

TRAINING FOR UNIVERSITY OF FLENSBURG RESEARCHERS 26 JUNE

Early in the year SAIS was fortunate to participate in some international research into inclusive education through a project, called Gender 3.0 at School. The project has been running from 2021 and will wrap up in 2026.

The project investigates how transgender, gender diverse, and intersex students experience school, with a focus on professional education for teachers. As part of the consultation SAIS is delivering a modified training session to cover the ACT and Australian school context when?

MEDICAL RIGHTS OF INTERSEX CANBERRANS

Following its introduction to the Legislative Assembly on Wednesday March 22nd, legislation to protect the medical rights of intersex Canberrans was passed with cross-party support on Thursday June 8th 2023. This historic moment has marked the ACT as the first Australian jurisdiction to implement such protections and legislative measures, putting us at the forefront of intersex human rights in Australia!

This achievement reflects many years of tireless community advocacy and commitment from the ACT Government. SAIS would like to particularly acknowledge the work of Intersex Human Rights Australia, Intersex Peer Support Australia, A Gender Agenda and Equality Australia in this process. The Bill protects the bodily autonomy, informed consent, and medical rights of minors (and adults under guardianship) in medical contexts by regulating the decision-making processes for medical interventions designed to alter, affect, or otherwise impact the sex characteristics of an individual with an intersex variation.

Sex characteristics include chromosomes, genitals, gonads, hormones, and other reproductive anatomy, alongside the secondary characteristics that emerge from puberty such as breast development, hair patterns/growth and changes in body shape and vocal pitch.

Intersex variations are a range of naturally occurring, innate, congenital differences in a person's sex characteristics that fall outside of typically understood social and medical norms for female and male bodies. People with an intersex variation may have sex characteristics that are considered both typically male and typically female or neither male nor female (sometimes termed "ambiguous").

SAIS celebrates the passing of this Bill and awaits the next steps towards implementation as it comes into full effect next year.

READ MORE ABOUT THE PASSING OF THE BILL



ABC News: ACT passes Australian-first legislation banning irreversible medical procedures for young intersex children. The bill stops deferrable treatments on intersex people's sex characteristics until they are old enough to consent.



Australian Human Rights Commission: Commission welcomes passage of new legislation protecting the rights of people in the Australian Capital Territory who have variations in sex characteristics (VSC) has been welcomed by the Commission.



Intersex Human Rights Australia: With cross-party support, the ACT Assembly has passed legislation introduced by Andrew Barr in March to protect the human rights of people with innate variations of sex characteristics in medical settings.



Equality Australia: Intersex advocates and LGBTIQ+ groups have welcomed Australia's first laws to protect intersex people from medical procedures modifying their sex characteristics without their consent, calling the ACT legislation a landmark moment for the nation.

THE NEW BILL BY THE ACT GOVERNMENT ADDRESSES THE ISSUES WITH LEGAL PROTECTIONS AND REGULATIONS AS PART OF A BROADER SUITE OF ACTIONS DESIGNED TO CREATE ROBUST PROTECTIONS. SAIS WELCOMES THE BILL.

Last year SHFPACT ran a grant project, Rainbow Representation, to identify and supply books that positively address, reflect and include stories, characters and themes related to diverse family structures, rainbow families, people who are same-sex attracted,

transgender, non-binary, gender diverse and intersex.

The collection also featured non-fiction texts about LGBTIQA+ history and historical figures, celebrities and role models, as well as texts that specifically address diversity and inclusion. Intersectionality was a key consideration with intentional focus placed on texts that portray a range diversity from writers with lived experience.
